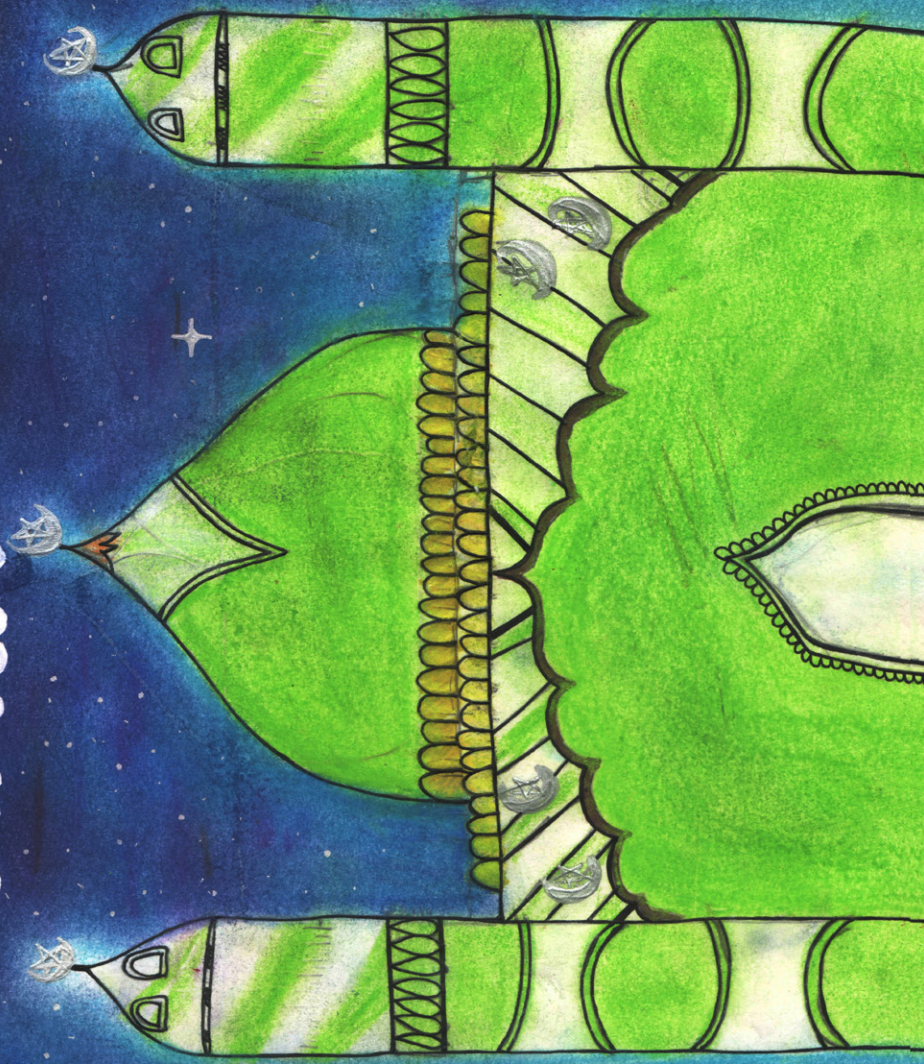
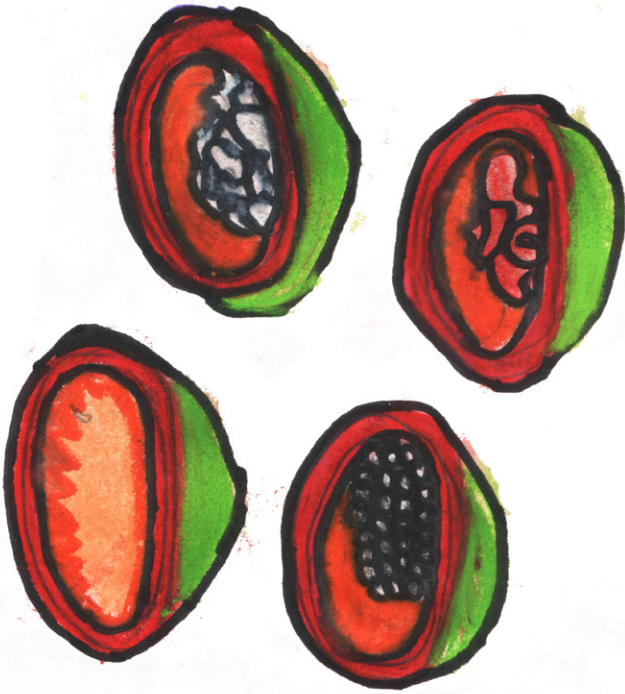


Eid Mubarak - a story by the children of Chimbel library



Our days begin with namaaz.



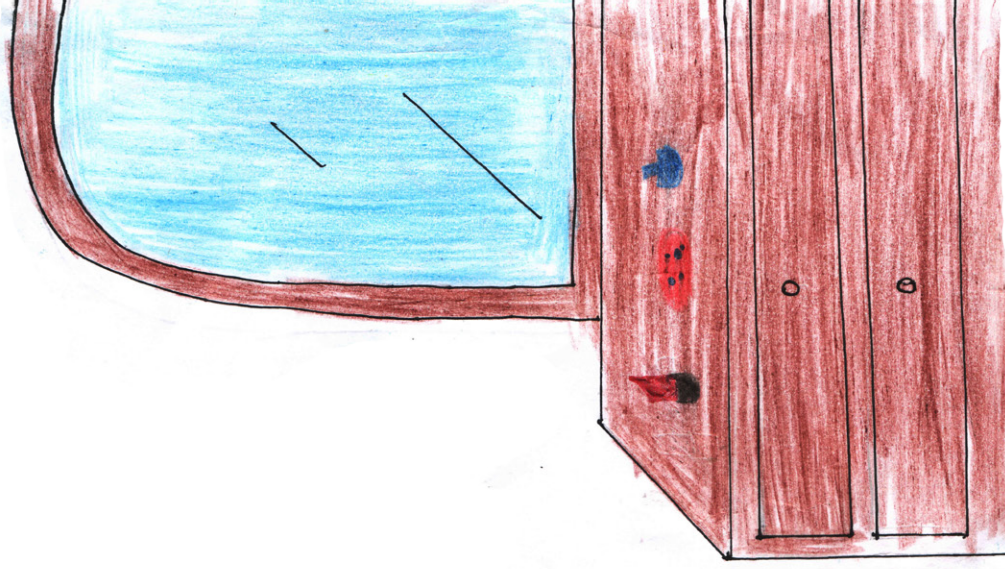
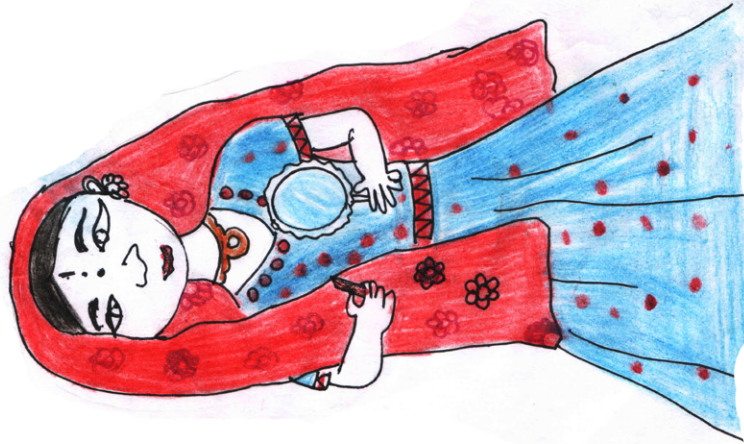


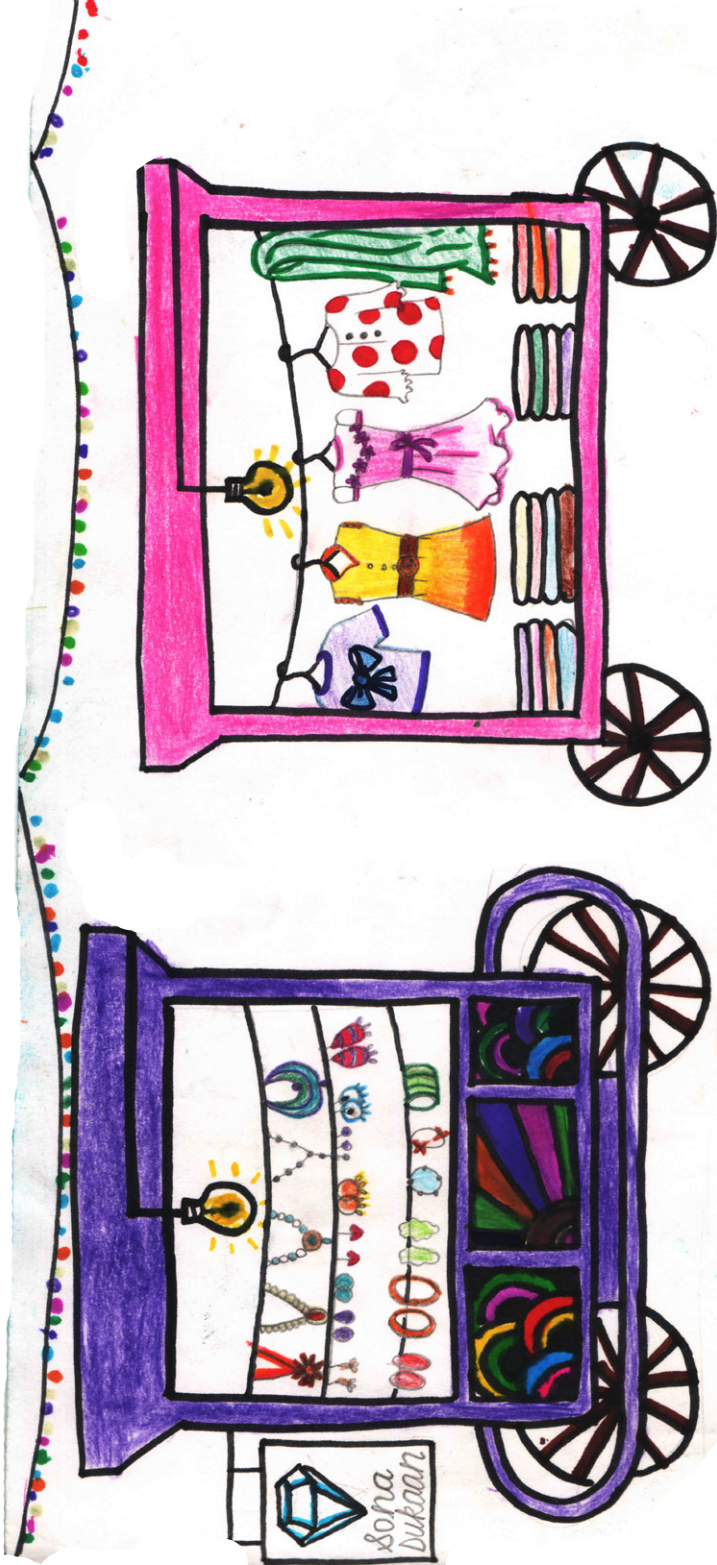
We prepare sheerkorma to serve everyone.

We get ready in our new dresses and wear makeup.





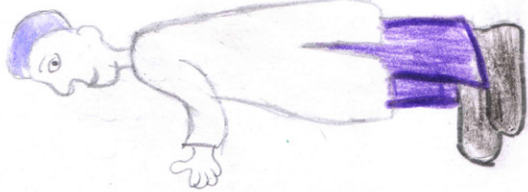
We go shopping.

Eid Mubarak

“Eid Mubarak” or Blessed Eid (Arabic: عيد مبارك) is a traditional Muslim greeting reserved for use on the festivals of Eid ul-Adha and Eid ul-Fitr. Eid means “Celebration” and refers to the occasion itself, and Mubarak means “blessed”; for example: performing the Eid prayer. The celebration continues until the end of the day for Eid al-Fitr and continues a further three days for Eid al-Adha.

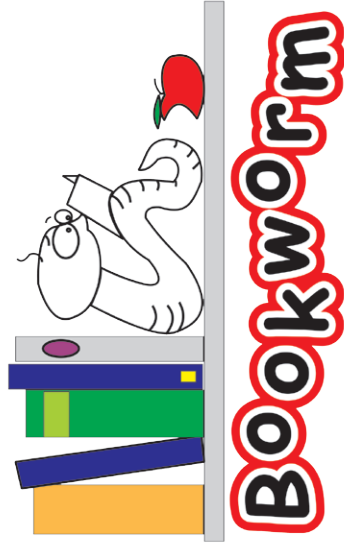
